This sequence allows students to earn their degrees and to meet Colorado Department of Education requirements for the teacher's license in four years. Because of the required overloads, this option may not suit the needs of all students. Summer school should be considered. Students who will have earned 120 credit hours may be able to graduate prior to student teaching. Students must pass the Praxis test in order to obtain a teaching license. Review requirements with an English education advisor each semester; not all upper division literature courses are appropriate.

The methods courses build upon one another; each is pre-requisites for the next. Enroll in these courses in the following order:

- ENG 3470 Young Adult Literature
- ENG 4600 Teaching Literature, Communication, and Visual Literacy 7-12
- ENG 4620 Teaching Composition 7-12
- ENG 4640 Teaching English 7-12 (Capstone) and ENG 4641 Field Experience: Teaching English in Secondary Schools (ENG 4640 and 4641 are co-requisites and should be taken the semester before student teaching.)

University Degree Requirements

- Complete a minimum of 40 upper division credit hours
- Complete a minimum of 120 credit hours
